

Graduate Qualities

Purpose

This policy describes the distinctive qualities of an Australian Institute of Business (AIB) graduate. These qualities will equip AIB graduates for roles in society and the workplace.

These Graduate Qualities will guide:

- AIB students who develop personally and professionally as they progress through their courses
- AIB staff who are engaged in curriculum development, learning and teaching strategies, evaluation and assessment practices
- AIB Research supervisors in their role of supporting and mentoring research candidates.

Details

AIB is committed to developing graduates who have the skills to be able to:

- a) communicate effectively especially through writing
- b) can work independently as well as collaboratively
- c) engage in life-long learning
- d) use systematic enquiry methods
- e) work as a reflective practitioner
- f) demonstrate problem solving and decision making abilities
- g) act in an ethical manner.

Guidelines for developing Graduate Qualities

- a) The Academic Director will work with the Course Advisory Committees and the subject coordinators to
 - i. design curricula that provide opportunities for the development of the Graduate Qualities within each course of study
 - ii. identify in each subject the relevant Graduate Qualities to be addressed in that subject
- b) Students are expected to:
 - i. actively engage in the learning and research experience
 - ii. work toward developing the Graduate Qualities to the best of their ability.
