

ACADEMIC FACILITIES POLICY

Purpose

To ensure that students, Candidates and staff have appropriate academic facilities and resources relevant to their mode of study or teaching that enhance their respective learning, research and employment experiences at AIB, noting that AIB is primarily an online higher education provider.

Scope

This policy applies to all AIB staff, students and Candidates.

Definitions

Unless otherwise defined in this document, all capitalised terms are defined in the glossary.

In the context of this policy and its associated procedure, the following terms and definitions apply, and are based on definitions provided in the TEQSA *Guidance Note:* Facilities and Infrastructure:

'facilities' refers to the teaching, learning and research environments, including both physical and digital learning environments, intended to promote and facilitate the learning outcomes and educational activities of AIB students and staff.

'infrastructure' refers to both physical and digital resources such as rooms, internet, e-learning/digital platforms and systems used by AIB students and staff.

Policy

1. Facilities for students and Candidates

- 1.1. AIB shall ensure that it has a safe and fit-for-purpose online learning, research and support environment for staff, students and Candidates. AIB shall ensure that it continuously provides secure access to digital information communication services, and learning and library resources, allowing for reasonable outages for maintenance and unforeseeable events.
- 1.2. AIB shall ensure that students and Candidates are advised of minimum system and internet requirements to study AIB online courses and are also advised prior to their enrolment with AIB of what AIB will provide free of charge.
- 1.3. AIB is committed to offering an interactive learning, research and support environment accessible by all students and Candidates.

1.4. AIB shall ensure regular updates of technical infrastructure to deliver optimal technical performance and to address potential cyber security risks.

2. Facilities for staff

AIB shall ensure that it has sufficient and secure facilities (including office accommodation) and equipment (including hardware, software and office equipment) for the appropriate number of staff to support AIB's students and Candidates, and to deliver AIB's academic operations requirements.
